He is a Panel Member (Mediator) of the Mediation Center of China Council for the Promotion of International Trade (CCPIT), and also a Panel Member (Arbitrator) of China International Economic and Trade Arbitration Commission (CIETAC), China Maritime Arbitration Commission (CMAC), Hong Kong International Arbitration Center (HKIAC), National Arbitration Forum (NAF, USA), the International Arbitration Court at the Chamber of Commerce and Industry of the Republic of Kazakhstan, Kuala Lumpur Regional Center for Arbitration (KLRC), the Arbitration Foundation of Southern Africa (AFSA) and Cairo Regional Center for International Commercial Arbitration (CRCICA).

As presiding arbitrator, co-arbitrator and sole arbitrator, Dr. Li has awarded more than 110 domestic and international arbitration cases, including arbitration under ICC Rules and UNCITRAL Rules. As the author, co-author and translator of many arbitration books and arbitration articles, he frequently speaks at international or domestic arbitration conferences and activities.

Charlie Manzoni Q.C., 39 Essex Chambers

As a qualified Mechanical and Electrical Engineer, Charles worked in the international development department of a multi-national blue chip industrial company for five years before qualifying as a lawyer and entering private practice.
