Prof Benjamin Hughes, Independent Arbitrator, The Arbitration Chambers (Singapore) and Fountain Court Chambers (London); Adjunct Professor, National University of Singapore Law School

Professor Benjamin Hughes was educated in both the civil law and the common law traditions, having studied law first at Seoul National University Law School (all coursework in Korean) and then at NYU School of Law in the US. During his studies at NYU he spent one semester studying at the University of Palermo Law School in Buenos Aires, Argentina (all coursework in Spanish). Prior to his legal studies, Professor Hughes studied East Asian history and languages at Harvard University, during which time he studied in Beijing and Seoul.

Professor Hughes practiced international arbitration at major US and Korean law firms in Korea, the US and Singapore before launching his practice as an independent arbitrator. Since then, he has been appointed in over 150 arbitrations in numerous jurisdictions around the world, with a particular focus on Asia. In addition to his busy practice as arbitrator, Professor Hughes remains actively engaged in academic writing and teaching. Before moving from Seoul to Singapore in 2018, Professor Hughes was a member of the Faculty of Law at his alma mater, SNU Law School, where he taught courses on international commercial arbitration and comparative law. In Singapore, he teaches an advanced practicum in international arbitration at NUS Law School.

Professor Hughes is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators, the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators, the Hong Kong Institute of Arbitrators. He is an Executive Committee Member of the Seoul International Dispute Resolution Center, a Member of the International Arbitration Committee of the KCAB, and a Director of the Korean Council for International Arbitration. He also serves on the editorial boards of the Asian International Arbitration Journal, the Journal of Korean Law and the Korean Arbitration Review.
